
Dear Parent,

We are writing to inform you that from Monday, 2 November 2020, the council will be trialling a 'School Street' on some of the streets around Eastbury Community School. A School Street is where roads around a school are temporarily closed to motor vehicles to become a pedestrian and cycle zone during pick-up and drop-off times. We know that 91% of children are offered their first preference school, so for many, walking to school is an option. By temporarily closing roads outside schools, it will make it easier and safer for children to get to and from school and reduce congestion and pollution.

The council is implementing the closures under an experimental traffic order and monitoring the benefits over an 18-month period.

As shown in the attached map, we will be closing Wilmington Garden between the junctions of Buller Road and Rosslyn Road

Closure times will be 8:00am to 9:15am and 2:45pm to 4pm on weekdays.

Automatic Number Plate Recognition (ANPR) cameras will be used to automatically check if a vehicle has a School Street permit. If a vehicle enters a School Street during the restricted times without a School Street permit a penalty charge notice will automatically be issued.

Parents will not be able to park in the closure zone and during the closure period, so please ensure that you have ample time to get to school, if you park further away, but we do encourage you to walk and cycle, where possible.
